This annual meeting is a Records Commission meeting of the Board of Education in public for the purpose of reviewing applications for one (1) time disposal of obsolete records, as well as to review schedules of records retention and disposition which are submitted by any employee of the district.

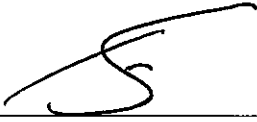
The records commission is established by statute, specifically R.C. §149.41. The commission is tasked with ensuring that a public entity properly stores and maintains its records, and when appropriate, takes the necessary steps to dispose of them legally.

R.C. §149.41 declares that each city, local, exempted village, and joint vocational school district, as well as each educational service center, must create a records commission that is comprised of the governing board president, school district treasurer, and superintendent. Our district also includes Members of our Board of Education. According to the law, the commission must meet at least annually
